**BACKGROUND:** Uniform Standards, Business and Professions Code section

<u>315</u> includes requirements, if a healing arts board orders a licensee who is in a diversion program, due to a substance abuse problem to undergo a clinical diagnosis evaluation,

In California Code of Regulations, Title 16, Section <u>1447.1</u>, the program director and a nurse or physician consultant shall interview each applicant. They shall recommend such

shall interview each applicant. They shall recommend such medical and/or psychiatric examinations as may be necessary to determine the applicant's eligibility for the program. The Intervention Evaluation Committee has the responsibility to make recommendations to the Intervention Program Manager regarding the terms and conditions of the intervention agreement for each registered nurse

participating in the IP, including treatment, supervision, and

monitoring requirements.

<u>315</u> authorizes the committee and the Board to implement work restrictions and pathways to returning nurses safely to

full and unrestricted licenses.

In BPC <u>2770.8(f)</u> each committee has the responsibility to make recommendations to the Program Manager regarding the terms and conditions of the intervention agreement for each registered nurse participating in the Program, including

treatment, supervision and monitoring requirements.
